


## **Speakers**

**Andrew Sellon**, retiring President of our Society and editor emeritus of the *Knight Letter*, is a professional actor and voiceover artist who has presented his one-man show about Mr. Dodgson, *Through the Looking-Glass Darkly*, to great acclaim.

**Edward Guiliano**, former president of our Society, president and CEO of the New York Institute of Technology, is the author or editor of eight books, including *Lewis Carroll Observed* and *Lewis Carroll: A Celebration*. He is a renowned expert on Victorian literature.

**Oleg Lipchenko** is an artist based in Toronto. His spectacular illustrations to *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* (Studio Treasure, 2007; trade: Tundra, 2009) won the coveted Elizabeth Mrazik-Cleaver Award. He recently illustrated *Humpty Dumpty and Others: Selected Nursery Rhymes* (Studio Treasure, 2008; trade: Tundra, 2010), and is currently working on the *Snark*.

**Adam Gopnik** is a noted critic, novelist, staff writer for the *New Yorker*, and a much sought-after speaker. His novels include the best-selling *Paris to the Moon*, and his latest Carroll-inspired children's work, *The Steps Across the Water*. He also wrote the introduction to Martin Gardner's *The Annotated Hunting of the Snark: The Definitive Edition* (Norton, 2006).

**Jenny Woolf** is the editor of *Lewis Carroll in His Own Account*, and the author of the new biography *The Mystery of Lewis Carroll: Discovering the Whimsical, Thoughtful, and Sometimes Lonely Man Who Created "Alice in Wonderland."* 

**Cathy Rubin** is the author of *The Real Alice in Wonderland: A Role Model for the Ages* (Henmead, 2010), a scrapbook-style biography of Alice Liddell Hargreaves, who was her great-aunt's aunt.
