

Venues and Speakers

Reynolda House Museum of American Art displays a premier collection of American art ranging from the colonial period to the present. Built in 1917 by Katharine Smith Reynolds and her husband, R. J. Reynolds, founder of the tobacco company, the house originally occupied the center of a 1,067-acre estate. It opened to the public as an institution dedicated to the arts and education in 1965, and as an art museum in 1967.

Charlie Lovett, past president of the LCSNA, is a noted collector and writer whose works include Alice on Stage, Lewis Carroll's Alice: An Annotated Checklist of the Lovett Collection, Lewis Carroll and the Press, and Lewis Carroll Among His Books: A Descriptive Catalogue of the Private Library of Charles L. Dodgson, as well as seven other nonfiction titles and a novel, The Bookman's Tale, to be published by Viking Press on May 30, 2013. His plays for children, including Friday's Happily Ever After, have been performed in over 2500 productions worldwide.

<u>Stephanie Lovett</u>, past president of the LCSNA, is a noted collector and author of *The Art of Alice in Wonderland* and *Lewis Carroll in Wonderland: The Life and Times of Alice and Her Creator* and co-author of the *Checklist*, above.

<u>Daniel Singer</u>'s three-man farce *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare* (*Abridged*) played in London's West End for nine years, and has since become one of the world's most popular shows. A noted authority on, and collector of, Disney Aliciana, he designs theme parks at Walt Disney Imagineering and continues to write plays, direct, sculpt, and act. *A Perfect Likeness* is the record of a fictional conversation between C. L. Dodgson (portrayed by Ben Baker) and Charles Dickens (Michael Kamtman).

Morna O'Neill completed her Ph.D. in the History of Art from Yale. She taught at Vanderbilt and is currently on the faculty of Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem. Her writings include *The Edwardian Sense: Art, Design, and Performance in Britain, 1901–1910* and the chapter "Kingdom of Darkness, Kingdom of Light: Photography in Victorian Britain" in *The Gift of Light: The Janos Scholz Collection of Nineteenth-Century European Photography*.

Mark Richards has been Chairman of the <u>Lewis Carroll Society</u> (UK) "on and off" since the 1980s and is the Executive Editor of <u>The Carrollian</u>. In 2011 he chaired the Lewis Carroll: Man of Science program at the London School of Economics, He is "an omnivorous collector of Carroll-related printed matter and ephemera, with a particular interest in illustration and fine art."

Long before the Disney Channel show of that name, there was a real artist named <u>Jett Jackson</u>. Her work is currently in over 500 collections worldwide and has been shown in more than 65 exhibitions in Los Angeles alone. A definite star on the rise, her work has appeared in *Art and Antiques*, *Vanity Fair*, *Art in America*, *Art News*, and numerous other publications. She was profiled in *Knight Letter* 81.

Mark Goodacre, son of famed Carroll collector and bibliographer Selwyn Goodacre, is a New Testament scholar and Professor at Duke University's Department of Religion, having earned his MA, MPhil, and PhD at Oxford. He has been a consultant for numerous television and radio shows, such as the 2001 BBC series <u>Son of God</u>. The "Victorian Evensong" will feature liturgy and music heard by Dodgson at Christ Church and a sermon by Mark based on an outline left in Dodgson's diary.
